Your inquiry has been received at the National Visa Center (NVC).

The applicant's name has been placed on the list of documentarily qualified cases awaiting the availability of visa numbers under the numerical limitations prescribed by statute. The designated representative of this case (applicant, petitioner, or attorney) will be notified of an appointment date as soon as the numbers have been received. The applicant should NOT make any travel arrangements, sell property, or give up employment until the US Embassy or Consulate General has issued a visa.

An immigrant visa is usually valid for six months from the date it is issued. It may be used to apply for admission into the United States any time during its validity. Please be advised that you may also contact the NVC via email at NVCInquiry@state.gov.

Please be advised that our office revised our guidelines for communication between the National Visa Center and the public. We are now required to verify case information each time we receive an inquiry.

According to U.S. law, the National Visa Center is only permitted to discuss details of a visa case with authorized representatives and when provided with all of the following information:

- " NVC case number or CIS receipt number
- " Petitioner's name and date of birth
- " Beneficiary's name and date of birth
- " Your full name

If you are inquiring about an I-140 petition you must provide the following information:

- NVC case number or CIS receipt number
 - Name of the petitioning company
- Beneficiary's name and date of birth
- Your full name
